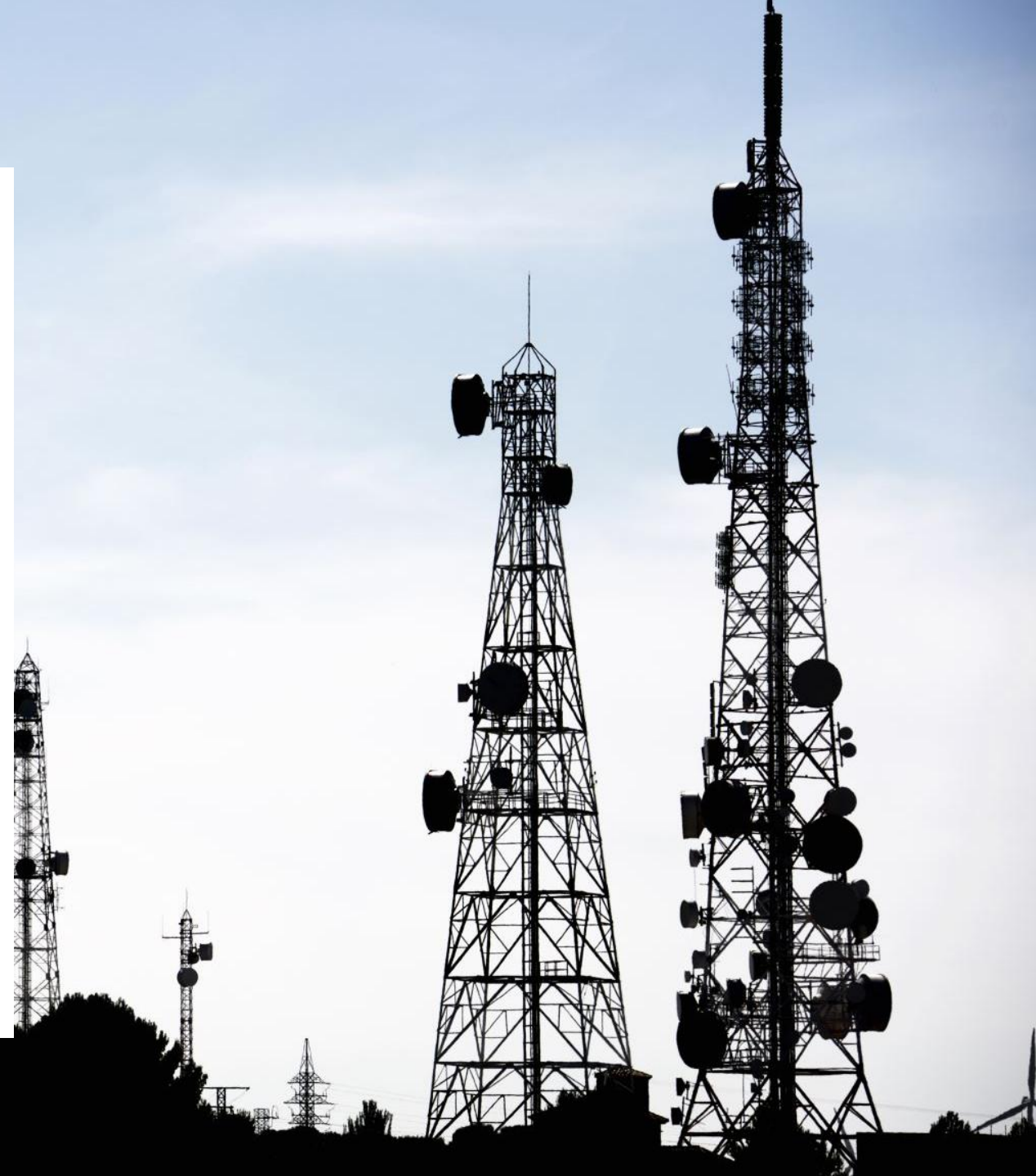



CUTTING THE CORD
